

SCHOLARSHIP SCAMS

If you have to pay money to get money, it's probably a scam. Every year students and parents are defrauded by scholarship scams. Scam operations often imitate legitimate government agencies, grant-giving foundations, education lenders and scholarships matching services, using official-sounding names containing words like "National", "Federal," "Foundation" or "Administration."

Visit: www.finaid.org/scholarships/scams.phtml to learn how to identify such scholarship scams. In general, be wary of scholarships with an application fee, scholarship matching services that guarantee success, advance-fee loan scams and sales pitches disguised as financial aid seminars.

TAKE A LOOK AT SEVERAL COLLEGES WHEN LOOKING FOR SCHOLARSHIPS

If you need scholarship help to attend college, don't limit yourself by applying to just one or two schools.

Competitive universities usually don't come knocking on your door offering scholarship monies like some of our other fine universities in Michigan. Many of them offer generous packages that are based on merit, not need. Students looking for scholarship help should apply to several schools to see which ones may offer help. Go to the colleges' websites to look at their scholarship offerings. Aggressive, timely research by students and parents is essential in the scholarship search. Be sure to check



ABHS 2025-2026 ELIGIBILITY POLICY

ANCHOR BAY SCHOOLS EXTRA-CURRICULAR ELIGIBILITY POLICY (Goes Into Effect for the 2025-2026 School Year)

POLICY

It is the responsibility of the student to know and adhere to the eligibility code of their school. Participation in extracurricular activities is a student's privilege, not a right, which can be removed at designated times for failure to meet the standards and requirements of Anchor Bay School District. For the purpose of this policy, an extracurricular activity is defined as any activity that is not part of the required curriculum for a course or is outside the regular course of study. This includes but is not limited to dances, athletic events, clubs, and performances.

These are the standards which must be met in order to participate in any extra-curricular activity:

- 1. Have satisfactory or better citizenship in five (5) of six (6) of their classes.
- 2. Pass six (6) out of six (6) classes.
- 3. Maintain a grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 from the previous trimester.
- 4. Student must adhere to the Anchor Bay Schools Athletic Code of Conduct.

If a student does not meet all of these standards at progress report and quarter report card time:

- The student is ineligible for a period of 1 week (including weekends).- The student will be allowed to sit on the bench, but not participate in games, while ineligible.
- The student can regain eligibility if he/she submits a progress report signed by each of his/her teachers on Monday of the following week which indicates his/her grades have met those standards.

If a student does not meet all of these standards at the end of the trimester:

- 1. Student is ineligible for 60 scheduled school days.
- A student may be granted a one-time exception to the 2.0 grade point average (GPA) if the student has at least a 3.0 cumulative grade point average (GPA).

Any student who meets the MHSAA eligibility standards (passing 4 out of 6 classes for the trimester) but does not meet the eligibility requirements of Anchor Bay High School for the previous marking period can apply for provisional eligibility by meeting with the Athletic Director (athletes) or Assistant Principal (non-athletes) and developing an Academic Improvement Plan.

The plan must include:

- A signed contract between the student, their parent(s) or guardian(s), and the athletic director or assistant principal detailing the steps the student must follow in order to work towards improving his or her academic performance.
- 2. A weekly report of the student's grades must be handed in to the athletic office by the student with:
 - Maintenance of grades which are currently above 2.0 must be verified.
 - b. Improvement of grades, which are below 2.0, must be shown.
 - c. Mandatory Attendance at weekly study sessions or lunch-time or after school tutoring.
- 3. The plan must include provision for:
 - a. Meeting with teacher(s) as appropriate.
 - b. Develop a daily schedule for time management.
 - c. Contact with school support services.

Plans will be developed by the athletic director/faculty on an individual basis. Students will be deemed provisionally eligible once a plan is signed. Failure to comply with the Academic Improvement Plan will result in the student being deemed ineligible for the remainder of the trimester.



GENERAL NOTICES

STUDENTS SIGNING OUT

When a parent or guardian gives permission for their student to leave school for emergency or medical appointments, the following must be adhered to for dismissal:

- **1.** If parent/guardian is picking the student up, the parent needs to come into the Security Office and sign the student out.
- **2.** If the student has a vehicle at school the Parent/guardian can call the school and speak to a secretary. A secretary will then call the student out of class, sign them out, and give them a pass.

ABHS CLOSED CAMPUS POLICY

DRESS CODE

GENERAL NOTICES



REMEMBER, YOU'RE NOT JUST FERTILIZING YOUR LAWN

Storm drains found in our streets and yards empty into our lakes and streams. So, when we fertilize our lawn we could also be fertilizing our lakes and streams! While fertilizer is good for our lawn, it's bad for our water. Fertilizer that enters our lakes and streams can cause algae to grow and use up oxygen that fish need to survive. So what can you do the help? Simple.

Sweep it. Sweep excess fertilizer and grass clippings from pavement back onto your lawn so that they don't wash into storm drains.

Buy low and go slow. First, find out if you even need fertilizer. Contact your Michigan State University Extension office to get a soil test. If you do need it, choose a fertilizer with no or low phosphorus—phosphorus causes algae growth. You can also use an organic or slow-release nitrogen fertilizer, which causes less harm to water.

Hire smart. Select a lawn care service that follows the practices noted above.

Mow high. Keep your lawn at three inches in height. Taller grass strengthens roots and shades out weeds.

Also, remember that the nutrients from grass clippings left on your lawn act as a great fertilizer.

Make fertilizer-free zones. Keep fertilizer at least 20 feet away from the edge of any lakes, streams or storm drains.
