PSAT/NMSQT TESTING

Tuesday, October 28 and Wednesday, October 29 junior students will be taking the PSAT/ NMSQT test in the main and auxiliary gyms. This test is a standardized test offered by the College Board that measures college and career readiness by testing Reading and Writing, and Math skills. It serves as an initial screen for the National Merit Scholarship Program, provides students with feedback on their academic skills, and familiarizes them with the <u>SAT testing experience</u>. Students will be split alphabetically over the two days of testing. A student list will be posted around the school as it gets closer to testing. The testing will run1 - 3 hours. When finished, students will return back to class for the remainder of the day. More information will be available in the coming weeks.



STUDENTS SIGNING OUT



When a parent or guardian gives permission for their student to leave school for emergency or medical appointments, the following must be adhered to for dismissal:

- **1.** If parent/guardian is picking the student up, the parent needs to come into the Security Office and sign the student out.
- **2.** If the student has a vehicle at school the Parent/guardian can call the school and speak to a secretary. A secretary will then call the student out of class and sign them out.

ABHS CLOSED CAMPUS POLICY

We have a closed campus policy at Anchor Bay High School which means that students are required to stay in school during lunch hour. Student may not exit the cafeteria during lunch without permission since classes are in session.

DRESS CODE

Students should dress and groom in good taste and in a manner that will do honor to Anchor Bay High School and themselves. Student dress should be clean, safe, and not disruptive to the educational process.



STUDENT BOOK DEBTS

Please remind your student that when he/she is assigned a textbook that they return the book to the teacher who issued it to them. Students will sign their initials upon receipt and return of their textbooks. This will ensure that your student will not obtain a book debt at the end of the school year.

FREE MICHIGAN SCHOOL MEALS

We want to inform you of a potential upcoming change regarding school meals. Due to the State of Michigan not yet passing a budget, Anchor Bay Schools may be forced to end the Universal Free Breakfast and Lunch Program on October 31, 2025. We hope a state budget will be approved before this date, which will clarify whether free meals can continue for all students. If a budget is not released by the October 31st deadline, or if it is released without extending the Free Meals Program, Anchor Bay Schools will have to end free meals for all students. If this occurs, starting November 1, 2025, families will be required to: Complete a **NEW** Free & Reduced Meals application to determine eligibility, or Pay for meals at the regular daily rate if they do not qualify (pricing to be determined). Detailed instructions regarding the new application, updated procedures, and pricing will be provided in October if guidance from the state budget is not available by then. We understand this potential change may cause concern, and we are committed to supporting our families through the transition. 

REMEMBER, IT ALL DRAINS TO OUR LAKES AND RIVERS - OCTOBER

Storm drains and roadside ditches lead to our lakes and rivers. So, any oil, pet waste, leaves or dirty water from washing your car enters a storm drain gets into our lakes and rivers without being treated. With almost five million people living in Southeast Michigan, we all need to be aware of what goes into our storm drains. How can you help? Simple.

- Sweep it. Do you have extra fertilizer, grass clipping or dirt on your driveway or sidewalk? Sweep it back onto your lawn. Hosing your driveway sends these pollutants into storm drains that lead directly to our lakes and rivers.
- Keep it clean. Whether in the street or in your yard, remember to keep leaves, grass clippings, trash and fertilizers away from storm drains.
- Only rain in the drain. Never dump motor oil, chemicals, pet waste, dirty or soapy water, or anything else down the storm drain. All of these materials pollute our lakes and rivers.
- Label it. Volunteer to label the storm drains in your neighborhood to inform residents that storm drains flow directly to our lakes and rivers. Call your local community for more information on storm drain stenciling programs.
