We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2023-24 educational progress for Anchor Bay Middle School South. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2024-25 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2024-25. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2024-25. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2024-25. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school has been identified as a TARGETED SUPPORT SCHOOL.

Anchor Bay Middle School South – Committed to Excellence The staff at Anchor Bay Middle School South continually reviews student achievement data to identify areas that present challenges. The staff also analyzes their curriculum and instruction in these areas, developing new methods to meet these identified challenges. Anchor Bay Middle School South also uses the annual School Improvement Plan process to advance teaching and learning.

State law requires that we also report additional information for the two most recent years.

- In the Anchor Bay School District, there are two middle schools. Children attend school based on the designated attendance boundaries. School of Choice applications are posted annually on the district website.

- The Anchor Bay School District meets the guidelines for school accreditation through AdvancEd. Each year, Anchor Bay Middle School South submits a School Improvement Plan to the Michigan Department of Education, outlining identified goals for student success. The academic goals for Anchor Bay Middle School South include working toward improvements in English Language Arts and Mathematics.

- Teachers use this district curriculum as the foundation of their instruction, which is based on standards developed by the Michigan Department of Education.
- Anchor Bay Middle School South's state assessment scores exceed statewide averages.
- In the 2023-2024 school year, Middle School South students were assessed in the following areas: ELA, 51% of our students were advanced or proficient Mathematics, 37% of our students were advanced or proficient.
- In the 2024-2025 school year, Middle School South students were assessed in the following areas: ELA, 48% of our students were advanced or proficient Mathematics, 35% of our students were advanced or proficient.
- Anchor Bay Middle School South holds Parent-Teacher Conferences annually. Conferences are well attended in the fall with 40% parent participation.

The staff and students of Anchor Bay Middle School South are proud of their accomplishments and are committed to continual improvement. The information in the AER reflects the high-quality education provided to our students. We remain dedicated to collaboration with all of our stakeholders to ensure our students' future success.
