# ***Keep Our Students Healthy and Safe!!!***

Children attending school should be capable of participating in the regular school program. **Children who have a fever, cold or cough, or is vomiting should be kept home for their own well being and the protection of the other children at school.** Exceptions (like asthma) are handled on an individual basis. **Children vomiting or running a fever may return 24 hours after** they have a normal temperature **without** taking ibuprofen or other medication and have stopped vomiting. If you have any questions, please contact the school office.

## ***The Debug System***

Anchor Bay School Liaison Officer, Officer Wilson, will be visiting classrooms to touch on Social Media and Anti-Bullying lessons to students in 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> grade. He will discuss their “digital footprint” online and the difference between conflicts and bullying. Officer Wilson offers students problem solving scenarios and has them practice using the “Debug System” that includes how to get adult help. We are fortunate to have this resource for our students. ### **The Debug System**

1. Decide to ignore.
2. Exit, walk away.
3. Be calm and use friendly words (say “please stop”).
4. Use firm words (say “I don’t like that”).
5. Get adult help.

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## ***CELL PHONE / DEVICE / TABLET REMINDER:***

**Taken from our District Handbook:**



The district recognizes that cell phones have become a part of daily life. Many students have them, however, we would discourage students from bringing them to school. In the event that students are instructed by parents to bring them, they must be turned off and stored in lockers during the day. The district assumes no responsibility for theft, loss, damage or vandalism to wireless communication devise brought onto district property.


**All cell phones or devices should be OFF and in lockers.** It is EXTREMELY important for parents to continue to monitor their child’s devices!

Cell phones can be useful when taught appropriately. Recommendations to block numbers and “limit group texting” at a young age.

### **Advice/Tips:**

- **Start Simple:** Enter phone numbers, apps and limit full access.
- **Limit Usage:** Check periodically for any deleted texts and browser history.
- **Exercise Etiquette:** Enforce your own rules and make sure your child respects the expectations.
- **Designate times** for “talking/texting” – after dinner, chores or homework.
- Have your elementary age child put the cell phone in a designated area at night for charging – not in their bedroom.
- **On the Bus:** Students are permitted to use them appropriately (music, games – quietly). NO PHOTOS OR TEXTING.
