Principal's Corner



It looks like October will be filled with lots of new and enriching learning experiences coupled with some fun-filled activities. Here are some strategies for academic success:

Review school safety. Talk to your child about the importance of following school and classroom rules.

Attendance. Stress the importance of regular attendance and being on time for the start of the school day.

Get to know your child's teacher. When parents and teachers are on the same team, kids do better in school. It is important to ask questions or share a concern about your child.

Set Goals. Students who do best in school have short and long term goals. Whether it is completing homework, learning to play an instrument, new sport or planning to attend college, your child needs goals to keep them on the right track.

Settle into a routine. Kids thrive on predictability. Have a regular time for homework. Set and stick to a regular bedtime. Plan a morning routine that gets everyone out the door on time.

Don't over schedule your child. Give them time to unwind after school, especially during the first six weeks of school.

Be genuinely interested in your child's schoolwork. Ask them about their favorite part of their day!

Insist that your child give their best effort in school. If your child knows that school is important to you, it will be important to them

Most importantly, read, read, read! Read to them, read with them and let them see you reading a book! It is the SINGLE most important way you can help your child in school. Research shows reading to your child helps develop language skills and long-term success in school.

Student Halloween parties are going to be held on **Friday, Oct. 31st** throughout the day. Teachers will be sending home more information over the next couple of weeks. **If you want to join in on the festivities, please make sure to fill out a Volunteer Form and submit it to the office along with a copy of your driver's license.** Forms can be found on the Anchor Bay website or picked up in the school office.

Our school-wide Halloween Parade will be held outside behind the school at 10 AM sharp – weather permitting!

ARRIVAL AND DISMISSAL

Please note that our day's start and end times **have not changed!** Classes will begin at 9:00 AM, with doors opening to students at 8:55 AM. **Please note there will be no student supervision until 8:55 AM.** Dismissal is a staggered dismissal, in which car riders get released at **3:40 PM.**

Upon arrival, students will enter the building through the following doors at 8:55 AM:

KINDERGARTEN students will enter and exit Door #6.

ALL BUS RIDERS enter Door #7 and should walk directly to their classroom.

ALL CAR RIDERS enter Door #2 and should walk directly to their classroom.

ALL SACC STUDENTS will be dismissed to the classrooms by staff members.

Once students get to their classroom area, they are to put their belongings away in their locker/cubby area and enter their classroom.

Our doors will be supervised by school personnel starting at 8:55 AM until approximately 9:05 AM. If your child is late for school, please park in the lot and walk them into the main office at Door #1. Sign your student in using the QR Code by the office door. Students will be let in to the office where they will receive a tardy pass and walk to their classroom. Parents are to remain in the entry area.

Dismissal Procedures:

DROP OFF LOOP is a **single lane.** Chesterfield Police worked with our staff to develop the safest method.

ALL BUS RIDERS will exit Door #7 and walk directly to their bus. Staff members and 4th grade safeties will assist students to their bus. Our youngest students will enter the bus first. All other grades will be called on a staggered dismissal rotation.

ALL CAR RIDERS will exit Door #2. Please pull all the way up to the loading zone. Students will enter cars from the sidewalk. If you meet your child at the door, please park in the parking lot and walk up. Do not exit your vehicle in the loop.

Thank you for your cooperation and patience! It has made a big improvement!



Late Arrivals due to Appointments

If your student has a doctor or dental appointment first thing in the morning and needs to order a hot lunch, **please contact the office no later than 9:30 to order them a lunch.** Our lunches are provided by another kitchen and need to be ordered first thing in the morning. Thank you for your cooperation.

Student Sign-In / Sign-Out Procedure

There is a QR code in place to sign your student in to or out of school. This code is located in the office entrance. Use your cellphone to scan the code and sign in/out, use the intercom button to talk to the office staff or have them open the door to let students enter. District policy is parents are to wait for their child in the vestibule area. Thank you for your cooperation! If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact the office.

ANCHOR BAY SCHOOL SAFETY

WHAT YOU WILL NOTICE THIS YEAR:

Each building is strongly enforcing visitor management procedures. In order to ensure building safety and security, parents/guardians/visitors will:

Did you know?

- Starting in preschool and kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school.
- Missing 10%, or about 2 days each month over the course of a school year, can make it harder to learn to read.
- Students can still fall behind if they miss just 1 or 2 days every few weeks.
- Being late to school may lead to poor attendance
- There is an unquestionable link between school attendance and school achievement.

Truance & Attendance Letters

Per district guidelines, parents will receive the following:

- Attendance letter #1 after 7 days absent and/or tardy.
- Attendance letter #2 after 14 days absent and/or tardy.
- Attendance letter #3 after 21 days absent and/or tardy.
- Excessive absences and tardies after 21 days must be reported to the Macomb County Independent School District Attendance Office.

Help your child come to school every day

- Set a regular bedtime.
- Help your child complete their homework and pack up their backpack the night before.
- Develop a morning routine.
- Encourage your child to attend school!
